Synopsis

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This is a synopsis for commercial services prepared in accordance with FAR Subpart 5.207. 70FB7021Q00000044 will be a request for Quote (RFQ) to provide Meals for Disaster Survivors (Reduced Sodium, Survivor Daily Rations, Short Shelf-Life and Commercial Meals)NACIS: 311991 – Perishable Prepared Food Manufacturing.

It is anticipated that multiple Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) awards will result from this solicitation. FEMA intends to award a Firm Fixed Price Contract with a base (6) months with four (4) one-year options and one (1) six-month option, all together totaling sixty (60) months.

The scope of this work encompasses contractor support to provide all personnel, containers, equipment, and facilities to perform Port Operations and Transportation Services from CONUS ports to the PR (to include Mona, Culebra, and Vieques) and USVI as well as retrograde support. Transportation needs shall be prescribed by task order award. Coordination, accountability, and supervision of these services by the contractor are essential to ensure success of the operation.

1. Period of Performance: The period of performance for the resulting IDIQ is A base period of performance of (6) months with four (4) one-year options and one (1) six-month option, all together totaling sixty (60) months. September 29, 2021 – September 30, 2026. Each task order issued will include a specific period of performance. All terms and conditions applicable to the base period shall extend to the option period(s) unless otherwise agreed upon and a formal modification issued by the FEMA Contracting Officer. The option year period(s) are subject to the availability of funds.

3. Hours of Delivery: The vendor shall schedule all delivery activities with the appropriate delivery point of contact after award. During an emergency declaration, delivery shall commence within 24 hours of delivery order award. Exact time will be provided in the Delivery Order Request for Quote. During steady state, delivery acceptance will be between the operating hours of Mon – Fri 8am – 2pm local time unless otherwise stated.



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4. Point of Contact: The contractor shall provide a primary and alternate (if applicable) Point-of-Contact person(s) who will have the authority to commit the company, as required to execute all Delivery Orders. During an emergency response, this or these individual(s) must be available to initiate Delivery Surge Order production 24 hours/7 days per week, including telephone/pager numbers/email for 24-hour contact.

5. Quantity Requirement

a. Stock Replenishment During Steady State

The contractor(s) shall be tasked to deliver meals to both Continental United States (CONUS) and Outside the Continental United States (OCONUS) FEMA Distribution Centers to maintain FEMA's readiness stock for disaster operations. FEMA will determine delivery quantities, schedules, and locations at the time of order. The Contractor shall have the capability to deliver up to 3,500,000 **reduced sodium meals** and up to 1,750,000 **SDRs** to any of the Distribution Centers within **30** days of the date of order.

b. Emergency Response

The contractor(s) shall be tasked to deliver meals during presidential declared disasters and/or other emergency events. To support this requirement, the contractor shall have the capability to produce and ship up to:

- 1,000,000 **Reduced Sodium Meals, Commercial** with a shelf-life between 30-36 months within **48** hours of notification.
- 1,750,000 **SDRs** with a shelf-life between 30-36 months within **48** hours of notification.
- 1,000,000 **Short Shelf-Life** meals with a 9-12-month shelf life within **48** hours of notification.

6. Contingency Support. In the event of the Department of Defense (DOD) contingency operations or other Homeland Security actions coinciding with FEMA's disaster support, the Contractor shall fulfill the requirement under the task order without disruption to services. **BASIS FOR AWARD:** The Government will make awards to the responsible/responsive offerors whose offer will be most advantageous to the Government based on Best Value.
